



EXCITING NEW PROGRAM

McLean County Arts Center has been selected to be a recipient of a National Endowment for the Arts matching grant for Arts Education in American Communities.

ROVER 2012: Mobile Arts Center is a visual arts education program that mirrors the classes offered at the McLean County Arts Center (MCAC) and is funded in part by Arts Education in American Communities through the National Endowment of the Arts. In each of the ten rural communities visited by ROVER 2012, up to forty-five youth ages ten to eighteen can participate without cost in three different media workshops.

The three-dimensional workshop will consist of ceramic exploration, construction, and decoration over three unique two hour classes. The two-dimensional workshop explores light, shape, space and color on a variety of plainer surfaces such as paper, canvas, and panel during two separate two hour classes. During the fibers media workshop, participants will be able to explore processes like weaving, felting, and even tie-dye during a two hour class.

To conclude ROVER 2012: Mobile Arts Center, MCAC will be exhibiting works made by the participants and workshop leaders in their Brandt Gallery. The exhibit will be open to public viewing on July 19th through August 24th, 2013 with an opening reception on August 2nd from 5-7pm.
